

Happenings on Capitol Hill, at the White House and in Federal Agencies



Recently, Advanced Biofuels USA board members, **Joanne Ivancic**, president, and **Bob Kozak**, treasurer, met with staff for Senators Debbie Stabenow (D-MI and Chair of Senate Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry Committee), Amy Klobuchar (D-MN), and Rob Portman (R-OH) about concerns that open fuels standards risk favoring non-renewable and fossil fuel alternatives over sustainable, renewable biomass-based fuels. They also discussed developments in engine technology (specifically Ford's ecoboost and GM's ecotec engines) that enable true optimized flex fuel vehicles to

achieve similar mileage regardless of ethanol/gasoline blend percentages.

Joanne also met with staff for Senators John Boozman (R-AR) and Richard Burr (R-NC) as she dropped off introductory materials for all the newly elected senators' staff who are working on biofuels issues.

Recently, Bob and Joanne have also worked with staff for Congressman Roscoe Bartlett (R-MD 6th) on issues ranging from algae to the open fuels standard to relative CO2 emissions from fuels produced using a variety of technologies from a variety of feedstocks. Congressman Bartlett is know as the Peak Oil Congressman and represents Advanced Biofuels USA's home district.

NASCAR also deserves a close look this season as they move to Sunoco Green E15. Advanced Biofuels USA covered the first NASCAR race using E15, the exciting "it takes two to tango" Budweiser Shootout. See reports on our exclusive interviews with Jim Campbell, Chevy's VP for High Performance Vehicles and Motor Sports who emphasized that GM is not racing unless biofuels are used; and with Mike Lynch, NASCAR's Managing Director of Green Innovation. The conversation with Dr. Lynch covered just about everything, from why NASCAR made this change to how they will deal with biofuel controversies like international ILUC (Indirect Land Use

Change) and greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions calculations, with talks about farm co-ops in the Midwest and recycling on race day in between. See <u>Part 1</u> and <u>Part 2</u> of this interview. Check out Joanne's explanation of the <u>new Sunoco Green E15 fuel system--from seed to wheel</u>. NASCAR required the most advanced production of corn

ethanol for this series. It was clear to us that if homegrown cellulosic ethanol was commercially available, we would probably see it in the NASCAR, Nationwide and Camp World Truck series.

The American Le Mans Series Winter Test at Sebring was a bit of a disappointment. There was a buzz that new E85 engines would come to be tested. That was not to be. No new engines; no new biofuels. Although <u>Butamax</u> is in the news a lot lately, the Dyson Racing Team seemed to have the fuel for racing, but no corporate sponsorship related to their work with their isobutanol. The BP side of the equation seems to be keeping a low profile these days, even when they might promote some positive advances in sustainable biofuels research.

Bob Kozak did get to drive the Sebring track as part of a group demonstration of a new smartphone app that helps people become more efficient drivers. <u>Go Green Auto Rally</u> is teaming up with ALMS to promote the app and related services as a prelude to many ALMS races through the year.

Projects Underway Volunteers and Our

Activities:

We have a lot of writing projects to report on this month.

Jesse Jin Yoon brought his engineering expertise to a paper, <u>What's</u> <u>the Difference between Biodiesel and Renewable ("Green") Diesel?</u>.

As Jesse explains, "Although both fuels can be derived from biomass, they are two distinctly different fuels. The purpose of this

paper is to define both fuels and provide a general comparison between the two fuels." Many people don't realize all diesel is not the same. Jesse breaks down the complexities into easily digestible segments that should be useful to teachers, students and all who need to make decisions about what to put in their vehicle fuel tanks.

Bill Brandon joined participants from across the United States, Canada, the Caribbean and internationally from India, the Middle East, Western Europe and Australia at the Municipal Solid Waste to Biofuels Summit in Chicago this February. He contributed a comprehensive <u>overview of the proceedings</u>. Bill will be doing more writing for the web site helping to make complex technical issues comprehensible to the general public. You may also see Bill's name as a commenter to articles about biofuels, advanced biofuels and engine development; bringing a knowledgeable perspective to sometimes emotional dialogs.

Bob Kozak has been busy. In addition to his green racing articles, he prepared a slide presentation for career tech/automotive classes that is also appropriate for any individual or group that wants to better understand how engine efficiency and advanced biofuel development go hand-in-hand. While in Florida, we accepted William Rosenblum's invitation to speak to three of his classes about the latest developments in advanced biofuels and related engine efficiency. Advanced Biofuels: Meeting Challenges in Fuel Supplies and Energy Efficiency, was the result. Downloads are available on the PowerPoint Presentations page in the Biofuels Basics section of the web site.

It begins with a summary of challenges to getting advanced ethanols and drop-in biomass-based fuels into production and to the marketplace. The second part discusses the types of motors being designed and used that optimize the characteristics of ethanol in order to achieve similar optimized mileage, regardless of ethanol/gasoline blends used.
